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


Dear <<First Name>>,

Welcome to our first edition of Iskul's e-newsletter that we promised to deliver.

As many of you know, all this started with a simple question to find out if the stateless Bajau Laut children in Omadal would like to learn how to read and write from their friends. After a trial class in August 2015, Iskul was set up with four Mastal Arikik (little teachers), a Headmistress and three members of the Board of Trustees (Trustees), with about 21-25 students.

How have our students fare after attending more than 80 weekend classes the <u>past 12 months</u>? You can get a glimpse of our students' <u>test result</u> conducted during the Trustees' <u>Assessment trip</u> in September 2016 below.



As Iskul celebrated our one year anniversary, we also held an <u>Awards Day</u> to celebrate our students' learning the last one year during the <u>assessment trip</u>. In this e-newsletter edition, we would like to introduce one of our students, Rubiniah who hopes to be able to read and write so she can work in the Semporna town. As part of our commitment to transparency and accountability, we had published our <u>financial summary</u> from August 2016 to September 2017 on our <u>Facebook page</u>.

The Trustees met online and offline for a two-day Strategic Planning Workshop in January 2017, as Hui Ling brought back her experience from YSEALI'S GO NGO'S workshop to facilitate the session. It was important as it helped us to relook at our commitment and priority towards Iskul, refine our vision, mission and plan for the next 12 months. As a result, we have stepped down from the Trustees into the Management and Operation Team instead. Shaffiyah sits in the Operation Team to monitor Iskul as she is based in Semporna. Adzmin, Hui Ling and Ee Chia are now in the Management team, working on funding-raising and communications, while supporting the Operation Team from afar.

For 2017, we finally managed to raise fund to hire Iskul's Field Coordinator and had a successful Bak Kut Teh fundraiser campaign sponsored by Eng Chun Bak Kut Teh. We are grateful to our friends, Yee Keong for spearheading the fundraising campaigns, Gene Harn and Christine in helping us to develop our fundraising kit and reviewing this e-newsletter's content. We are also thankful to Sean for designing our first e-newsletter and for sponsoring and managing Iskul's website - <u>iskul.my</u>
