We apologise for the long silence, however, rest assured that we haven't been idle.

The past two years have been busy, busy, busy, for Iskul Sama Dilaut Omadal. From providing aid during Covid-19 lockdowns to hosting a monthly 'Pesta Bulan Paluwak' festival, Iskul has been engaging the community of Omadal in various interesting and sustainable ways.





Although 2020 was a tough year for us all, it was even tougher for the community in Omdal who, before Covid-19, were already living day-by-day. Iskul became a homebase to the students and their families as well as the rest of the communities in Omdal, both stateless and otherwise. Our work was recognised when we received the Yayasan Hasanah Special Grant in 2020 (YSGH 2020). It sustained our operations from July 2020 to September 2021. Moreover, it also enabled us to initiate social development projects for the community.



In 2021, on top of providing basic literacy classes and nutritious meals to our students, we also kick-started two social development projects. These projects centred around community healthcare in two aspects. First, was a community water project where we provided improved water access for hygiene education and practices which was critical in view of the Covid-19 pandemic. Second, we

provided nutrition by way of supplements to increase maternity and children's health. These two milestones reinforced our holistic approach to education.

Students can achieve their academic potential when they and their families are healthy and secure. This program was mainly funded by the Yayasan Hasanah Special Grant (YHSG 2020).

We have been busy this year too! On top of our regular classes, we have launched a new Marine Stewardship Module in collaboration with marine experts from Reef Check Malaysia. We also initiated a Life Science Program, Content Creator Program and Waste Management Pilot Project funded by the UNDP Small Grant Project. The content creator program trains 10 youth, both stateless and Malaysian, to tell stories of Omdal to the wider community through video productions uploaded to Iskul's YouTube. 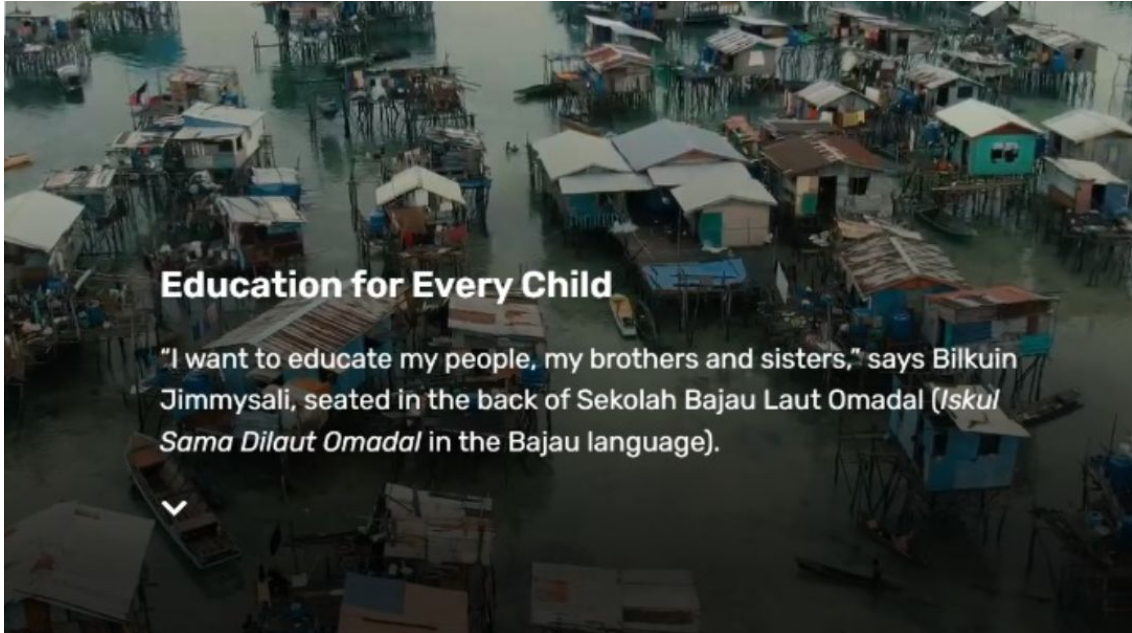
Watch our students perform "wayang kulit" in their mother tongue to share about the danger of Covid-19 with their community in our YouTube channel.
