Iskul E-News | Addressing the recent concerns on Iskul's establishment

Greetings from Iskul!

Happy New Year! As we step into a brand new year filled with hope and possibilities, we extend warm greetings to you and your loved ones.

In light of recent events, it is with a heavy heart that we share disconcerting news about Iskul Sama DiLaut Omadal. Regrettably, a Facebook post has emerged, casting doubt on Iskul's legitimacy and expressing reservations about its existence on Pulau Omadal. The post outlines various concerns, particularly questioning whether Iskul has obtained approval from Omadal's residents or community representatives to operate the school. It alleges that Iskul's presence unfairly impacts Omadal residents, suggesting a link to the rise of social problems within the community. In response, Iskul, in partnership with the CSO Platform for Reform (Sabah Chapter), has issued a joint press statement urgently calling on the government to safeguard and endorse a secure educational environment for marginalized stateless children at Pulau Omadal. This statement also endeavors to dispel perilous misconceptions surrounding Iskul's establishment and has garnered endorsements from 38 local residents, 72 CSOs, and 20 individuals.

To address the concerns raised, let's delve into key aspects of Iskul's establishment and mission:

- Permission and Support: Iskul, contrary to some claims, is not established without permission; it has garnered support from the authorities and obtained permission to operate from the then JKKK of Omadal, Haji Jimlan and the then District Officer of Semporna, Dr Chaco Hj Bulah. The 2017 letter of support was further copied to relevant authorities such as the Education Department, Unit Pemimpin Pembangunan Masyarakat, police, marine police and state assembly-persons.
- Community Participation: Iskul was co-founded with the participation of the local community, specifically the children and women, in 2015. It is important to note that Iskul's mission extends beyond providing education to stateless children of the Bajau Laut community; it is committed to advocating education for all children, including the children of Pulau Omadal. The school is founded with a community participatory approach,

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children from the community in Omadal who laid the first foundations of Iskul Sama DiLaut Omadal. Iskul later engaged Cikgu Jefry and other teachers at the request of its young teacher and co-founder, a resident of Omadal, to join the school to teach and guide them. Iskul's establishment of a community health centre is also centred around making healthcare accessible to all without discrimination, offering free health check-ups to both local residents and the Bajau Laut community.

- Holistic Approach: Our holistic approach at Iskul Sama DiLaut Omadal goes beyond traditional education, aiming to instil strong moral values in our students. It organises diverse programmes such as aktiviti sukaneka, pesta kebudayaan, content creation, first aid services, medical checkup, and gotong-royong that also involves the local residents of Pulau Omadal where positive impact on the community and the environment has been commended. By actively engaging them in community-based programs and fostering a sense of responsibility, we aspire to empower these young minds to become active and contributing residents of Pulau Omadal. This approach is all about cultivating a sense of duty and citizenship, contributing to a decrease in potential social problems, as our mission aligns with the post's claims and concerns. We believe that a well-rounded education encompasses both academic excellence and the development of qualities that will make our students valuable members of their community.
- Historical Context: Furthermore, the historical context of Semporna and the Sulu Sea must be recognised where the Bajau Laut community has existed for a long time, living as sea nomads. The Sulu sea and its surrounding islands have been their home tracing back to almost a thousand years, historically only coming ashore for trading purposes or to shelter from storms.
